# TEACH STUDENTS HOW TO TRACK

Allow students to take ownership of their performance and internalize success by incorporating tracking tools into classroom activities.

Track objective mastery percentages, unit test scores, or reading level growth.



#### APPEAL TO STUDENT INTERESTS

Incorporate students' interests, passions, and hobbies into your instruction. Connect classroom learning to the real world.



# REFINE AREAS OF FOCUS

Partner with your students to identify specific learning gaps. Ensure students can communicate specific steps toward success.



### ASSESS FOR LEARNING

Use formative assessments and recurring check-ins to plot student progress. Chart growth metrics while also celebrating milestones to keep spirits high.

### CONFERENCE WITH STUDENTS

Use one-on-one sessions to provide feedback and offer encouragement. Help students self reflect by posing questions like "why do you think you were able to show so much growth?"



PLPs are powerful tools when used regularly to keep parents involved and communicate progress. Revisit and revise plans as goals and learning abilities change.
